Sister Patti Doyle, who was the Villa Director for 14 years, shared that the "ministry of preparing for and welcoming guests was a blessing to me and the staff." During her tenure at the Villa, Sister Patti met "many wonderful people seeking a more meaningful life," and it brought her much joy. Project Recaps

During our closure in June, all of our scheduled repair projects were successfully completed. In one corner of the balcony we found significant dry rot in the upper and lower support columns, both of which needed to be completely replaced. All of the large windows in the Dining Room and Seaview Room needed to be removed so that









the framing could be inspected for weather damage and repaired as necessary. Water damage and dry rot were evident throughout the ocean facing area. Also in June, we completed some painting projects. The exterior of Siena Hall, the west wall of the main house, and the exterior of Josephine House all received a protective fresh coat of paint.

Alejandro (our Maintenance Manager) re-painted the interior of Josephine House and a new luxury vinyl floor was installed to replace the worn carpet. In the main house and in Siena Hall, staff re-organized the artwork and furniture to make the rooms more coordinated and comfortable. SISTER ANASTASIA'S APPLE CAKE RECIPE

1 tsp salt

1/2 cup oil

2 tsp vanilla 4 cups diced apples 3/4 cup nut meats

Blend dry ingredients; add and beat well eggs, oil and vanilla. Stir in apples and nuts. Pour into 9"x13" greased and floured pan and bake at 350 degrees for 45

cheese, 1.5-2 cups powdered sugar, 2 tsps vanilla and pinch salt. Spread over cake.
